We discussed the confusion regarding the Peruvian Dinner. Later contact with Todd Overbo informed us that at 4:00 p. m. the youth would be practicing songs, and that the actual program would start at 4:30 and the meal would be around 5:00.

Next year on All Saints Day we should light the candles with the “candle lighter” and not a disposable lighter. It was too difficult for many to light.

Pastor Jean showed us the Worship Folders she ordered for Advent along with the envelopes for contributions at Christmas.

We will do the Thankful Tree again this year keeping the tree on a lower level so that everyone can bring up their own leaf after the Joys and Concerns and before the prayer. The organist will play a quiet “thankful” song while this is being done. We will do this on November 15th and 22nd and will announce it during the service on 11-8-15. We will also put the hooks into the leaves before they are given out so that people can write on them and hang them the same day. Kathy and Barb will cut out more leaves.

We are presenting the Thanksgiving Service this year. It will be on 11-22-15 at 7:00 p.m. The offering from this service will go toward the Fortney Meal Ministry. Worship committee members will all bring cookies/bars to serve afterwards. Kathy will make the coffee. The bell choir will play and we may get a couple of singers from one of the other churches. The speaker will be Susan Fox from Franklin/Southwest Prairie/Northwest Prairie. Barb will line up ushers and greeters for this service.

We will again use the Creche during Advent. Each week we will add someone new: 11-29-15 will be the animals, 12-6-15 will be Mary/Joseph, 12-13-15 will be the shepherds, 12-20-15 will be the angels, and 12-24-15 will be the baby Jesus.

The Sunday School program will be held on 12-13-15.

There will be a sanctuary decorating event on 11-23-15 from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. Everyone is encouraged to help. Many hands make light work.

The hanging of the greens will be on Sunday, 11-29-15. We have a wreath, crown of thorns, pine cones, basket, bell, and Advent Candle Ring. Kathy will supply the tree. Joanne Hornby usually supplies the lamps for the windows. We still need to get a sprig of Holly and greens for the windows.

Kristin will find out when we need to get the poinsettias ordered and put order forms in the Worship Folders on 11-29-15.

Kathy will line up readers for the weekly Advent Candle lighting. Liberty Pole will be responsible for the Christmas Eve candle this year (we alternate).

Pastor Jean will determine how many speakers she will need for the Lessons and Carols and line them up herself. She will also do a “Time for Children.”

We are looking for a family with a small baby for the Christmas Eve service.

Pastor Bill Busch opened the meeting with devotions based on Matthew 6:33. He challenged us to think about our purpose and where we envision ourselves ten years from now. Why should people come to either of our churches? Jesus challenged us to go and make disciples. Are we accomplishing this? Our Mission Statement was reviewed.

Rev. Busch led the business meeting. The following reports from each church were reviewed:

Budgets were reviewed. Viroqua proposed a total budget of \$142,708.00. Bob Starr made a motion to accept the budget. Betty Ross seconded. Motion passed.

Liberty Pole proposed a total budget of \$69,441.98. Barb Robson made a motion to accept the budget. Steve Thompson seconded. Motion passed.
